Our aim is for children to have represented the school at least once in each Key Stage.</p> <p>We have been able to use competitions to target specific children/groups. These groups include SEND, PP and the less active.</p> <p>Transport has enabled us to attend 48 different competitions this year. Cover has been provided so that a teacher can be at an event. This shows the children how highly valued PE is and allows the teacher to assist the children in reflecting on the competition/festival. This allows children to apply skills they've learned and look in more depth in areas such as tactics.</p>

This has seen a rise in the number of children attending clubs (12%). The extra use and support with this equipment also led to the boys' athletics team qualifying for the School Winter Games for the first time.</p> <p>The goals allowed the school to host the district football trials and other intra school competitions. It also allowed for smaller sided games to increase the number of touches children have and therefore improve their confidence, performance and involvement.</p>
<p>To hire a specialist teacher from Sporting Chance to work alongside school staff to increase their subject knowledge and delivery of the curriculum.</p>	<p>Hiring a specialist to up-skill teachers when teaching PE. Over a term, teacher's team teach with specialist coaches and adapt planning for following lessons. The teachers will be selected based on questionnaire answers and expertise.</p>	<p>Autumn Term £1950 (15 weeks)</p>	<p>Children will be receiving quality lessons and the staff will be developing their skills to ensure that their lessons are of a consistently high standard. On the follow up questionnaire 77.7% of teachers involved (7 out of 9) in the process felt more comfortable and this was reflected in the views of the children regarding their PE sessions.</p> <p>Part of the role was to provide a lunchtime club that focused on girls particularly those that</p>
